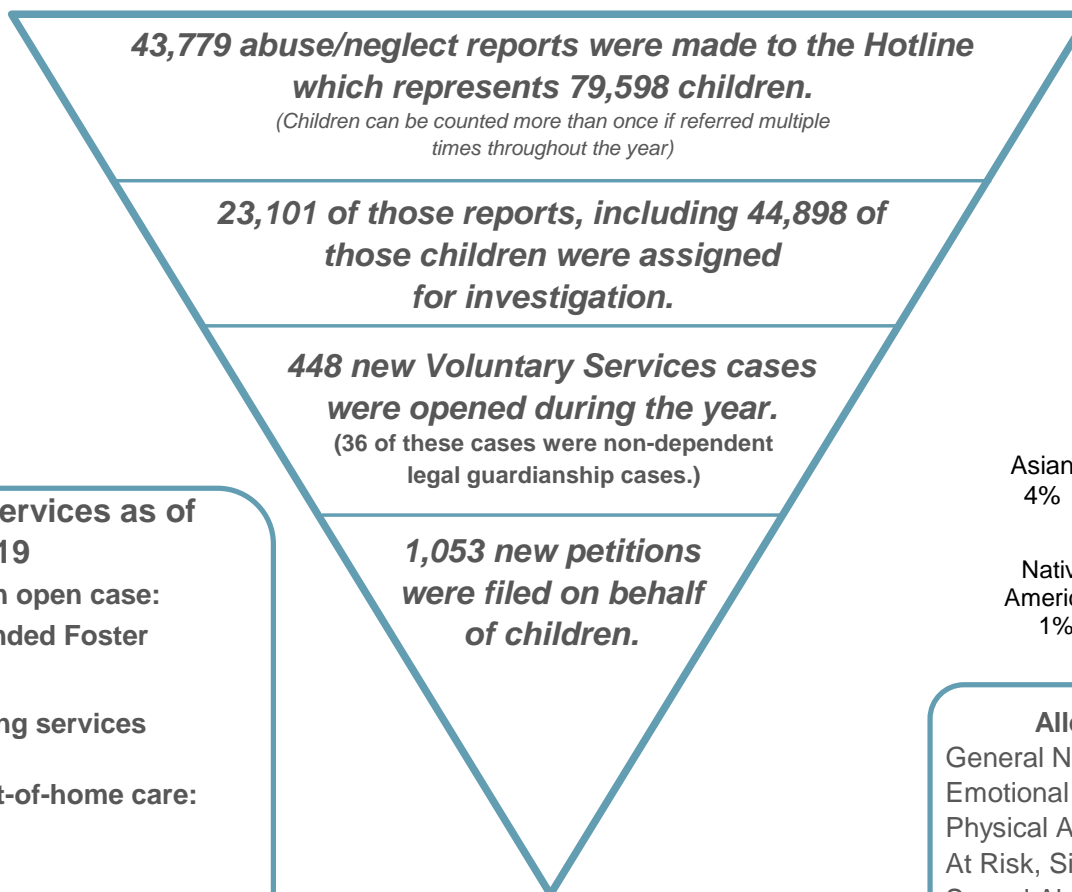
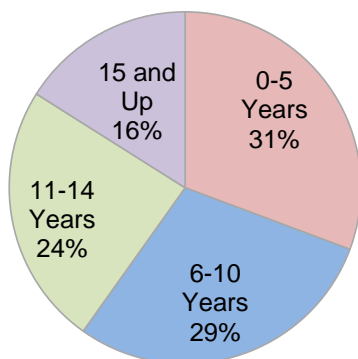
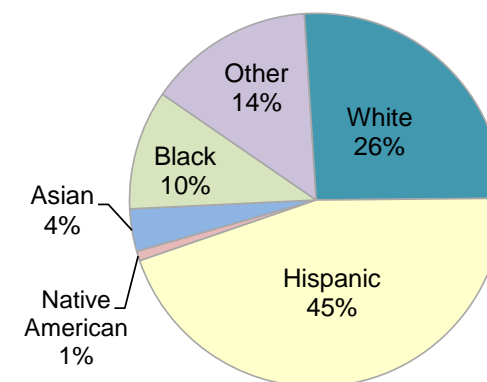

Children Receiving Services as of July 1, 2019

3,086 children and youth in an open case:

- 305 young adults in Extended Foster Care (EFC)
- 828 children were receiving services in their home.
- 1,953 children were in out-of-home care:
 - 31% Kinship Care
 - 66% Non-kinship care
 - 34% Resource Family Homes
 - 12% Guardian and Court Specified Homes
 - 9% Foster Family Agency Homes
 - 4% Group Home
 - 4% San Pasqual Academy
 - 3% Temporary Shelter Care Facility
 - 2% Adoptions pending/finalized
 - 1% Other (e.g. trial home visits with parents, non-foster care placements)

Allegation Types

General Neglect	43%
Emotional Abuse	32%
Physical Abuse	32%
At Risk, Sibling Abused	23%
Sexual Abuse	19%
Severe Neglect	2%
Caretaker Absence/Incapacity	1%
Exploitation	0.4%

Children may have multiple allegations, therefore the percents will not equal 100%

369 children were placed in adoptive homes during FY2018/19

Child Welfare Services Fiscal Year 2018/19 Regional Statistics

North Coastal⁴

7,500 children (3,995 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2019:

130 children were receiving services

- 93% were dependents¹
- 2% were in voluntary services
- 5% were pending

77 were in out-of-home care

- 51% kinship care
- 47% non-kinship care

North Central³

5,922 children (3,323 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2019:

194 children were receiving services

- 71% were dependents¹
- 25% were in voluntary services
- 4% were pending

An additional 4 youth were in EFC

116 were in out-of-home care

- 20% kinship care
- 78% non-kinship care
- 3% other

Central

10,983 children (5,513 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2019:

447 children receiving services

- 74% were dependents¹
- 23% were in voluntary services
- 2% were pending

An additional 1 youth was in EFC

268 children were in out-of-home care

- 22% kinship care
- 78% non-kinship care

Centralized Child Welfare Services (CCWS)²

26,757 children (16,319 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2019:

952 children were receiving services

- 98% were dependents
- 2% were in voluntary services
- .1% were pending

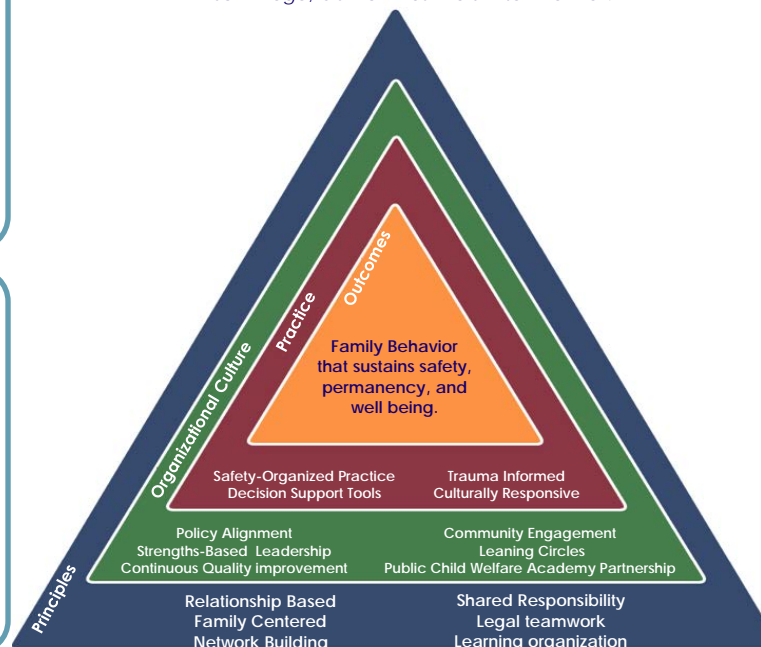
An additional 300 youth were in EFC

885 children were in out-of-home care

- 36% kinship care
- 59% non-kinship care
- 1% other
- 5% adoptions pending

North Inland⁴

9,815 children (4,969 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2019:

284 children were receiving services

- 51% were dependents¹
- 42% were in voluntary services
- 7% were pending

157 were in out-of-home care

- 16% kinship care
- 82% non-kinship care
- 3% other

East

9,991 children (5,300 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2019:

369 children receiving services

- 72% were dependents¹
- 25% were in voluntary services
- 2% were pending

230 were in out-of-home care

- 37% kinship care
- 63% non-kinship care

South

8,630 children (4,360 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2019:

405 children were receiving services

- 69% dependents¹
- 30% were in voluntary services
- 1% were pending

220 were in out-of-home care

- 30% kinship care
- 70% non-kinship care

¹ Children can be in three types of status: dependents, which are children receiving services ordered by the Juvenile Court; voluntary services; or pending.

² CCWS consists of Residential Services, Adoptions, Critical Assessment for Release Early (CARE), Child Abuse Hotline, Extended Foster Care, Indian Specialty Unit, Medical/Deaf Services Unit, and San Pasqual Academy. These programs serve all six regions.

³ The North Central Region includes the Medical/Deaf Services Unit

⁴ When a voluntary cases is opened in North Coastal, the case is transferred to North Inland.
